

Gibraltar Cryptocurrency Stamp To Be Issued In May

The Cryptocurrency stamp, issued by the Gibraltar Philatelic Bureau Limited in conjunction with HM Government of Gibraltar and Coinsilium, will be available on pre-order as from the 19th of April

In a bid to commemorate the financial and technological advancements of Blockchain, the Gibraltar Philatelic Bureau and Her Majesty's Government of Gibraltar are issuing a limited edition 2021 commemorative postage stamp with the theme of 'Cryptocurrency'. The Gibraltar Cryptocurrency Stamp has been produced with view to be tied to the release of a blockchain based Digital Collectible, or NFT (non-fungible token) produced exclusively by Coinsilium's Gibraltar branch in collaboration with Vietnam-based RedFOX Labs.

Limited to just 50,000, the Gibraltar Cryptocurrency Stamp is to be issued in a Presentation Pack which will include the stamp accompanied by a plethora of articles on various topics relating to the subject of Blockchain and Cryptocurrency.

Purchases of the Gibraltar Cryptocurrency Stamp will be accompanied by an exclusive first entitlement to an NFT digital collectible, prior to its general release in July.



A total of 100,000 NFT's with the theme of Gibraltar, featuring 22 views of local landmarks commissioned to local photographers, will be pre-minted for the occasion and delivered online, each pack containing two NFT's. The NFT's will be minted with five levels of scarcity: Common, Uncommon, Rare, Ultra Rare and a further two, Mythic Rare.

The Gibraltar Cryptocurrency Stamp and Presentation Pack will retail for GBP 6.95 with a worldwide flat rate for postage of GBP 2.50 per order, and will be available from the Gibraltar Philatelic Bureau's sister website WOPA+, whom have adapted to offer the possibility of accepting payment in major cryptocurrencies, including Bitcoin and Ether.
